ACCORDING to St Luke's account of the "Triumphal Entry" into Jerusalem, Jesus, as he approaches the city, looks at it and weeps. And he weeps because he says, "Jerusalem, if only you knew the things that make for peace." And he says, "The time is not far off when your enemies will set an encampment against you, and they will dash you against the rocks and your little ones with you and leave not one stone upon the other, because you did not know the time of God's coming to you."

"Would that you knew the things that make for peace." He could be saying that just as easily today — would that the world, the United States, Europe, Russia, knew the things that make for peace. In a way they do, but they don't somehow live out of those things; they live out of other things, antagonisms and fears and aggressiveness and things of that kind. I thought a lot about Jesus' tears for Jerusalem, how he would be weeping still, again, today for the same reason: "Would that they knew the things that make for peace."
